

2022-23 High School Interterm II Offerings Jan. 4-6, 2023

*Please note: student who sign up for Interterms involving travel outside of the normal school day are expected to go. Make sure to check with parents, coaches, etc. to confirm you are able to go. No exceptions for sports, family vacations, etc.

Local Service with Leon Bauman (13 students)

Students will learn about service opportunities in the local community and appreciate the value of community service. We will visit at least three separate non-profit organizations locally and engage in their mission.

Jesus People with Amy Thut (13 students)

Jesus People is a church family of nearly 200 people living together in intentional community, in the Uptown neighborhood of Chicago. We will be spending three days with them to learn about communal living and serving the poor. Activities will include a prayer walk in their neighborhood, helping to serve lunch or do other volunteer work, eating at an ethnic restaurant, and having discussions with members of their community. We will travel to Chicago Wednesday morning and return Friday evening. *Out of school travel: Wed.-Fri. No exceptions for sports, family vacations, etc.*

Dance Studio with Edgar Silva (13 students)

Do you like dancing? How good are you at it? What types of dancing do you know? How about some Dominican bachata or merengue? How about some Puerto Rican salsa or some Colombian cumbia? What about West Coast swing? Did you know that dancing is one of the best ways to exercise your body, your mind, and your spirit in a very healthy and fun way? Well, if you are interested in learning about the history, cultural importance and, of course, the basic steps for some of these dances, then come and join us for this Dance Studio Interterm. ¡Vamos a bailar!

Ucanplele Ukulele with Benji Hurst (13 students)

Jump start your future career as a touring ukulele player...or walk away from class knowing just enough to make others think that you are an accomplished ukulele player. Learn to play many basic chords and to play along with songs. Get your own Kala Waterman Concert Ukulele to keep.

International Cuisine with Renae Yoder & Michael Walker (20 students)

In this interterm we will prepare international cuisines from scratch with the help of guest chefs. We will also dine at one of Michiana's internationally-flavored restaurants and visit some ethnic markets. Be prepared to try new foods!

Umpire School with Brent Reinhardt (13 students)

This course addresses the most important definitions, rules, and mechanics students need to take the first step into becoming a baseball umpire. There will be labs as well as classwork to learn how to umpire baseball games. This course is for those who seriously want to get an umpires' license, want to learn the game better, or just simply enjoy baseball. The final afternoon students will take the umpire exam together.

Composers' Workshop with Danielle Svonavec (13 students)

Students will learn how to compose several short pieces including a piano miniature, a ground bass piece and a round using noteflight online software. Students will have opportunities to compose alone and in groups. No previous experience with music theory or instruments is necessary. Students will receive their own noteflight account that they can continue to access after interterm.

Things That Fly 2.0 with Calvin Swartendruber (12 students)

If it flies, we'll play with it! Design, build, and launch your own model rocket. Try your hand at flying the school's DJI Phantom 3 drone. Earn your recreational drone pilot's certificate. Ride the simulators at the AirZoo and tour an airplane factory. And if that's not enough, take a helicopter ride and then get a short flight lesson while you are at the controls of a real plane at the Goshen airport! This interterm meets all three interterms (#1, 2, 3). There will be several day trips; no overnight travel.

Chicago Art Museum: Make and See with Christa Janzen (12 students)

We will spent the first 2 days of Interterm looking at famous artworks at the Art Institute of Chicago and re-creating the styles and techniques we see. On Friday* we will travel to the Art Institute of Chicago and spend the day there looking and sketching!

Bicycling Culture & Camping with Josh Weaver & Michael Yeakey

(20 students)

Students will be introduced to the big world of cycling, including a visit to a velodrome (indoor bicycle racetrack) to learn how to ride a single-speed racing bike, training on indoor trainers, learning the basics of bicycle maintenance and repair, and planning the logistics of a fully self-supported three-day cycling camping trip in the June Interterm.

Signing up for this Interterm is also a commitment to Interterm 4 (May 31-June 2), involving overnight travel. Please do not sign up for this if you cannot commit to the travel. No exceptions for sports, family vacations, etc.
