Oct. 5-7

Local Service with Leon Bauman (12 students)

Serve our local community by visiting several organizations in the area and learn about the services they provide.

Local Boating (Kayaking, Canoeing, and Sailing) with Amy Thut (10 students)

October is a beautiful time to enjoy the outdoors! We will spend one day canoeing on the Elkhart River, one day kayaking on the Pigeon River, and one day sailing on Syracuse Lake. We will return to Bethany by 3:30 pm each day. *Limited to 10 students due to space on the sailboat.*

World Cup Fever with Edgar Silva (12 students)

Do you know what the World Cup is? Are you ready for it? Do you know when it will happen? Do you know which teams are playing? Who are the top players in it? Do you have a favorite team? Who do you think will play in the final? Who will win? Are you ready for it?

Come and join us for this interterm class where we will be learning about the history of the World Cup and everything related to this unique sporting event that happens only once every four years. We will learn about key players, the history of the tournament, the brackets, the groups, and more. We will watch some of the most important games in the history of the World Cup. We will make our predictions and create our own fantasy league. We will collect and exchange official stickers to complete our sticker albums. We will talk about the power this tournament has to bring the whole world together... and so much more. It will be all about soccer...or futbol, as they call it all over the world!

Exploring Printmaking with Christa Janzen (12 students)

Discover the endless creativity of 3 different Printmaking techniques: monoprinting, etching and linocuts! You will be able to create your own designs using each technique. This class is designed for those who like drawing and experimenting with new materials. It will also (possibly) include a 1/2-day trip to the Imagination Spot in downtown Goshen to use their printing press!

Being Well with Michael Walker (12 students)

We will discuss different areas of wholistic wellness such as physical, emotional, social, and spiritual wellness. Students will be invited to consider and try new strategies and activities that promote wellness in multiple aspects of their life. After completing this interterm, students should leave with a better idea of what affects their well-being and how to influence it.

Star Wars: 2D Movies-3D Models with Benji Hurst (12 students)

Students will view the original Star Wars trilogy: A New Hope, The Empire Strikes Back and Return of the Jedi. After watching each episode, we will review, sketch and ultimately design, print and assemble 3D printed kit card models of our favorite ships from the films.

Basketball Referee School with Brent Reinhardt (12 students)

Take the court with confidence trained on NFHS-approved basketball rules and mechanics. See the rulebook come to life in this introductory course in basketball officiating that will set a solid foundation for you when you step out onto the court. You will learn the fundamentals of game administration, scoring and timing, and violations and fouls, and much more! Participants will be encouraged to take the IHSAA basketball officials test to become a licensed referee.

Pictures At An Exhibition with Danielle Svonavec (12 students)

This course will study the music from Musorgsky's famous suite, Pictures at an Exhibition, and the art that inspired it. Students will travel to Chicago to hear the symphony's performance of the orchestral version of the piece.

Things That Fly 2.0 with Calvin Swartendruber (12 students)

If it flies, we'll play with it! Design, build, and launch your own model rocket. Try your hand at flying the school's DJI Phantom 3 drone. Earn your recreational drone pilot's certificate. Ride the simulators at the AirZoo and tour an airplane factory. And if that's not enough, take a helicopter ride and then get a short flight lesson while you are at the controls of a real plane at the Goshen airport! This interterm meets all three interterms (#1, 2, 3). There will be several day trips; no overnight travel.
