## Interterm I - Course Descriptions

All Things Baseball Michael W. Travel - None

We will dive into major events and icons in the history of the game, discuss rules and strategies, keep up with the current playoff push, and likely play a little ball ourselves.

Students will learn how coffee is grown, picked, distributed, roasted, and brewed.
